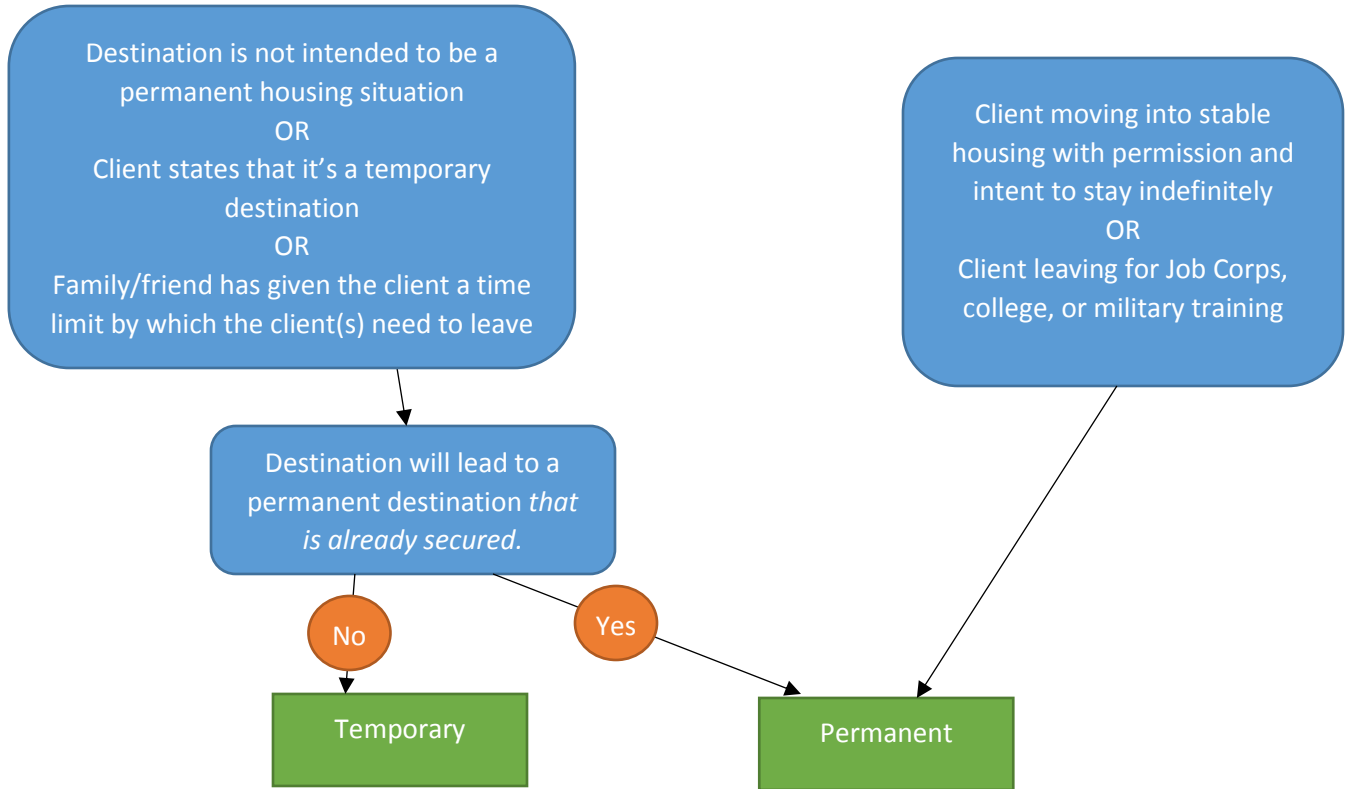
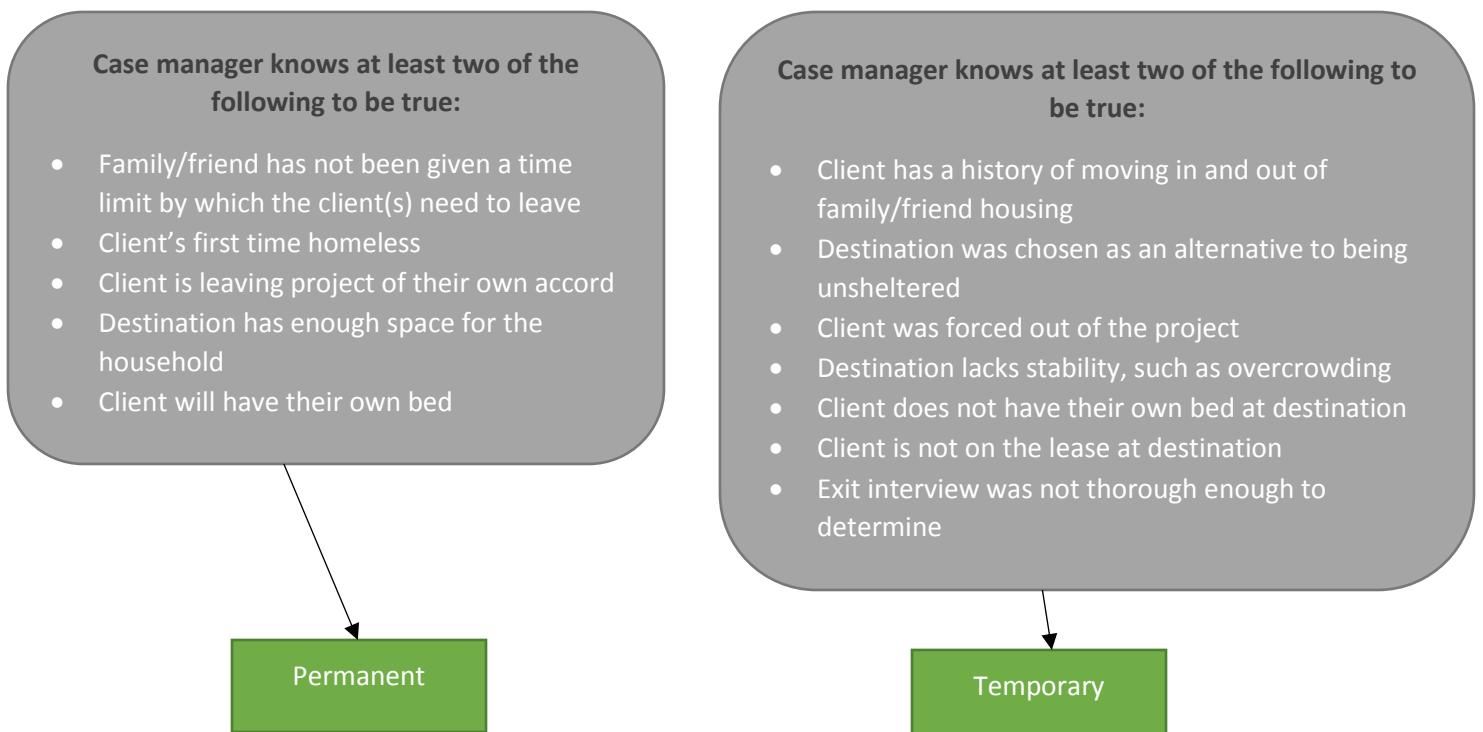


Destinations to Family or Friends

Destinations to Family or Friends

This guide is meant to aid case managers in more accurately and consistently answering the Destination for clients exiting to friends or family across the Balance of State CoC. While many situations will be obviously Permanent or obviously Temporary, some destinations to family or friends are less clear. The Decision Tree on the next page is divided so that at the top, case managers can use information from the Exit Interview to determine how to record the Destination. The bottom half is only for use in cases where the case manager did not get a clear answer as to the nature of their client's family or friend stay.

A less prescriptive version of the defining characteristics are listed below.

	Permanent	Temporary
Definitely	Clients leaving for Job Corps, college, military training	
	Exit is short term, but will lead to a permanent destination <i>that is already secured</i>	
	Client moving into stable housing with the permission and intent to stay indefinitely	
Leans	Client has not been given a specific time limit by which they need to leave	Family/friend has given a time limit by which the client(s) need to leave
	Client is leaving project of their own accord.	Client states that it's a temporary destination
	Enough space for the household	Not intended to be a permanent housing situation
	Will have their own bed	
	On the lease	
	Client's first time homeless	Chosen as an alternative to being unsheltered.
	Lacks stability, such as overcrowding (more than 2 people per room)	
	May not have their own bed situation	
	Not on the lease	
	Client has a history of moving in and out of family/friend housing
